### Authorities to enforce 'no refusal' for holiday drivers

Tarrant County law enforcement agencies will conduct a

“no refusal” policy for impaired drivers over Memorial Day weekend.

Any driver whom authorities stop for suspicion of drunken driving who refuses a breath exam will “be subject to a court-ordered blood test,” according to a news release from the Tarrant County district attorney’s office.

The initiative begins at 9:30 p.m. Friday and ends at 5:30 a.m. Tuesday. Officers will have access to “expedited judicial warrants and centralized blood-draw locations,” the release said.

District Attorney Sharen Wilson said the policy applies whether “it’s your first time to drink and drive or if you’re a callous repeat offender.”

**Police seek tips in hit-run  
that killed teenage girl**

Police are asking the public to help them find the driver or drivers who struck and killed an Azle High School

student last weekend.

Savanah Moss, 16, was found about 12:45 a.m. Sunday lying under the Steward Street overpass along State Highway 199. She was taken to John Peter Smith Hospital and died about 2:30 a.m.

The Tarrant County medical examiner's office concluded that Moss was struck by at least two cars, but police said they did not find evidence at the scene to confirm the finding.
