Town officials release
resident survey results

Recent survey results reveal 85 percent of the town's residents are "very satisfied" or "satisfied" with the overall quality of government services, according to data from one of the nation's leading community-based market research firms.

The ETC Institute conducted the survey during the summer to help town leaders make decisions concerning the allocation of resources, to measure the effectiveness of services, and to help decide the future direction of the community.

The Composite Customer Satisfaction Index was 127, much higher than the national average of 100. The town

set new satisfaction highs in four areas: emergency preparedness, communications, customer service and code enforcement.
